EVERY STUDENT, A SCIENTIST

Which central processing unit performs optimally for games? How does coffee affect one's mood and energy? Which chemicals increase the temperature of the flame when burned?

These questions, whose answers shape how we design our technology, carry out our businesses, and conduct our lives, are part of what drives scientific discovery at San Miguel School. At San Miguel School, this curiosity isn't just encouraged—every student becomes a scientist.

Each spring, students design, test, analyze, and present a project that uses the scientific method to solve a problem of their choice. Their weekly college-style science labs prepare them for independent research, while their dedicated science teachers provide guidance throughout the process.

This year's Annual STEM Fair Expo showcased the top ten projects, with evening attendees selecting William F.'s earthquake-resistant building research as the winner. His success, along with all the innovative presentations that night, demonstrates how San Miguel students develop real solutions to meaningful challenges.

San Miguel became the first Miguel model school to earn Cognia STEM certification, meeting the standards for a collaborative, high-quality STEM program that creates relevance with the real world.



SAN MIGUEL STUDENTS EXCEL IN READING

While national reading scores continue falling post-pandemic, San Miguel School students are thriving. Our scholars consistently outperform expectations, with students improving their National Percentile Ranking by over 21 points on average. The Class of 2025 achieved the highest reading scores in San Miguel’s history on the High School Placement Test.

Why are San Miguel students, 90% of whom qualify as English Language Learners, succeeding when others are not?

OUR PROVEN APPROACH

A CULTURE OF READING: At San Miguel, every class is a reading class. Every subject requires students to interpret, analyze, and apply information from texts. Additionally, students receive 80 minutes of daily English Language Arts plus 40 minutes of Independent Reading—double the time of typical schools.

COLLABORATION, RIGOR, AND ENGAGEMENT: Teachers create demanding, interactive lessons that bring texts to life. This year, eighth graders conducted a mock trial based on *12 Angry Men* and sixth graders explored Greek mythology through Percy Jackson novels while studying Ancient Greece in social studies.

A MODEL THAT DEFIES THE ODDS: Every element of San Miguel’s reading approach is intentional, and teachers’ dedication to their students’ success, along with their passion for learning, drives impressive results. This focus on reading—strategizing to enhance engagement and critical thinking, tracking progress daily, and integrating reading across subjects—creates an environment where students not only build skills, but also develop a true love for reading that continues to serve them for the rest of their lives.



- high school essay writing support

High School Juniors with a 3.0 GPA or higher are invited to participate in our annual Ivy League Tour, creating a powerful cycle where academic achievement opens doors to inspiration, and that inspiration fuels even greater academic ambition.

The high school graduating class of 2025 has been under the wings of our GSP team since their San Miguel graduation and we are thrilled to see them pursuing higher education at a rate of 88% this fall. San Miguel's Graduate Support Program includes:

When Stefan Rincon sets his mind to something, nothing can stand in his way. In 2017, he entered Sewanee: The University of the South with

support from the prestigious Posse Scholarship. Initially pursuing International & Global Studies, he found the program didn’t align with his goals, so he took matters into his own hands. From the hallways of San Miguel to the emergency room of a Los Angeles hospital, Dr. Emmanuel “Manny” Callejas has never lost sight of his mission

to serve others. After earning his undergraduate degree from Georgetown University, Manny studied medicine at Howard University, where he pursued his dream of becoming a physician. Today, Dr. Callejas provides emergency care to patients in their most vulnerable moments. His dedication to service extends beyond medicine—he became the first San Miguel alumnus to serve on the school’s Board of Trustees, giving back to the community that helped shape his path.

Oscar Zelaya has always possessed the kind of determination that sets him apart.

In 2021, Oscar achieved a historic milestone – he became the first San Miguel alumnus to be sworn into the bar association. Today, he works at Holland & Knight LLP as a document review attorney, where his career success comes as no surprise to his former San Miguel teachers. “Oscar was incredibly hard working, intelligent, and knew how to avoid distractions,” recalls Dr. Palank, who taught social studies at San Miguel when Oscar was a student. “He was a student that seemed destined for success because of his grit.”

PROJECT NORTH STAR: SAN MIGUEL'S FUTURE

Project North Star builds on the foundation of our college-focused Graduate Support Program and addresses the urgent need for **sustained, personalized, and data-informed support** for Latino male students from low-income families as they navigate complex educational and career pathways.

KEY COMPONENTS

- **Integrated Alumni Data System:** A centralized, Salesforce-integrated platform to track outcomes from middle school through age 25.
- **Diversified Counselor Model:** A four-counselor team with long-term caseload continuity and specialized focus areas.
- **Career Pathways and Networks:** Structured internship pipelines, employer partnerships, skill-building workshops, and access to supportive career support networks.
- **Enhanced College Support:** Data-driven strategies for persistence, especially for first-generation college students.
- **Family Engagement:** Bilingual digital tools, workshops, and college trips to support families through post-secondary transitions.

GOALS

- Equip each graduate with the tools, relationships, and resources to graduate from high school, persist in college, and launch a meaningful career.
- Build a robust data system to measure long-term alumni outcomes and inform targeted interventions.
- Develop a replicable, research-informed model of alumni support for underserved communities.

SAN MIGUEL CELEBRATES SECOND COOKE SCHOLAR IN TWO YEARS

Last summer, student Simon R. (Class of 2025) became San Miguel's third Cooke Young Scholar, a recipient of the Jack Kent Cooke Foundation Scholarship.

The highly competitive Jack Kent Cooke Foundation Scholarship names a mere sixty recipients nationally and is awarded to high-performing seventh-grade students. The first San Miguel student to receive the scholarship was Kelvin Mejia in 2008. Just last year, Lander (Class of 2024) also received the award.

As a member of the Cooke Young Scholars Program, Simon will receive the largest scholarship of its kind in the country, comprehensive academic and college counseling, and other services such as summer programs and networking opportunities. The Cooke Foundation is dedicated to ensuring high-achieving, low-income students have the support necessary to develop their talents and excel educationally.

Simon will begin high school at St. John's College High School in the fall, and Lander will continue as a sophomore at St. Anselm's Abby School.





FINANCIALS

San Miguel School continues to strengthen its financial position, ending the fiscal year with \$3.46 million in revenue and a positive net of \$557,000. Despite an expected decrease in revenue, due to the one-time grant of \$1 million from the A. James & Alice B. Clark Foundation in 2024, San Miguel's financial foundation keeps getting stronger. Our reserve fund has grown to over \$3 million as we enter the 2026 fiscal year.

Looking ahead, we plan to keep building these reserves and convert part of them into an endowment, which will provide long-term financial stability for the school. Thank you for your continued support as we work to secure San Miguel's mission for years to come.
